Board of Trustees Meeting- January 8, 2020

Willow Hall

Present were L. Maiocco, C. Lupo, E. Murphy, F. Weinstein, A. DAmato, S. Tozzi and S. Falk-Zitelli. Also present were Community Manager – J. Schultz, Accounting Administrator – M. O’Connor, Service Manager – J. Snyder and Recreation Director – M. Lighthipe.

This meeting commenced at approximately 1:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPEARANCES:

Jordan Weed, Patrol Officer from the Manchester Police Department spoke about the most common scams that are taking place in Manchester Township and she let residents know how to handle them.

Mayor Kenneth Palmer from Manchester Township explained the process regarding the recent tax assessments.

ITEMS VOTED ON:

F. Weinstein moved to waive the reading of the minutes. C. Lupo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

F. Weinstein moved to approve the December 4, 2019 minutes. S. Falk-Zitelli seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

A.DAmato moved memorialize the purchase of an ATTTL85S 85 gallon aluminum split transfer tank from Henrichinc.com for a total cost of \$1,122.78. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3150 - Property Fund Replacement. The unaudited balance for this account as of 11/30/19 is \$932,955.88. S. Tozzi seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

E. Murphy moved to approve the amendments to the LVW Bylaws Relating to Leasing or Rental of Units. C. Lupo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The mailing of the ballots will be on Thursday, January 9, 2020 and the Special meeting will be held on Monday, February 10, 2020 at 10:00AM in the Auditorium at Willow Hall.

There were no Committee reports due to the Holiday season.

M. Lighthipe, Recreation Director gave a report for the Recreation Department.

COMMUNITY MANAGER REPORT: (J. Schultz/ J. Snyder)

J. Schultz, Community Manager thanked the Ad Hoc Parking Committee for researching additional parking and reviewing the Parking Policy. The Board has agreed to dissolve the Ad Hoc

Parking Committee, leave the current Parking Policy as is and not add any additional parking spaces at this time. The Election Committee currently has openings for new members. If any Resident is interested in becoming a member, please submit a resume to election@lvwa.net or by mail to 959 Buckingham Drive, Manchester, NJ 08759.

J. Snyder, Service Manager mentioned that the Maintenance Department is installing new benches in LVW. The ongoing tree project is in the next phase which is trimming the dead wood. The Board of Trustees are currently discussing and reviewing swipe door access to the Recreation buildings.

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. The Board recently asked to review maintenance costs and responsibilities on the subject of repair and maintenance of windows, in particular, glass replacement. In contradiction to the governing documents, the Association has continued to provide maintenance, including replacement of window glass. After much discussion, the Board has agreed to no longer warranty glass; however, the Association will continue to service components like springs, and other window parts, if available. The Association will honor all glass replacement service requests currently in the system but have suspended taking any new orders. The Association is currently seeking a vendor who could continue to replace glass at a reasonable cost for members.

A Town Hall meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 29, 2020 at 1:00 PM in the Willow Hall Auditorium regarding the gate entry system of LVW.

The next meeting open Board meeting which is the Audit meeting, will be held on Wednesday, January 22, 2020 at 7:00 PM in the Willow Hall Auditorium. The following open Board meeting will be held on Wednesday, February 5, 2020 at 1:00 PM in the Willow Hall Auditorium.

There being no further business, the Board meeting adjourned at approximately 1:53 PM.

Audience Comments-January 8, 2020

A brief audience comments period followed the business portion of the open Board meeting at 1:54 PM with residents raising questions or concerns or seeking clarification about a variety of issues.

J. Taylor asked if the Association dues will continue to increase each year especially since the residents are receiving less service. He mentioned that he has reached out to the Maintenance Department regarding the cleaning of the gutters on his unit and has not been successful with a response.

Response: There is no guarantee what the Association dues will be next year. The Service Manager, J. Snyder will schedule to have the gutters cleaned at your unit.

M.L. Doner thanked the Board for the new gym equipment. She reminded residents of gym etiquette and rules. There will be tutorials on how to operate the equipment on KLVW and Creeper.com.

J. Lyness mentioned that previous funds from the Recycling Club were donated to the needs of the Village and now donated to the Association. He asked if the funds could also be donated to the LVW Clubs. Also, as a way to make money for the village, he suggested that RV spaces be charged per month. He spoke about the cable that was installed in a unit.

A.Pedowitz thanked the Recreation Director, M. Lighthipe for a great New Years Eve party. He stated that the holiday decorations in and outside the Village looked nice but if LVW could recognize the other two holidays when decorating outside the Village.

J. Laudicino thanked the residents who supported, donated and volunteered for the LVW Thanksgiving Day dinner.

K. Hooyer suggested that with the new rule of window glass replacement in LVW it may be a good time to replace your windows. She mentioned that Manchester Township has a home improvement program that will assist with replacing windows.

Response: More information regarding the Manchester Township home improvement program can be found on their website.

M. Lamberti asked what process the Association is following regarding the upcoming vote for the Bylaws Amendment Relating to the rental or leasing of a unit. She asked if there will be a private signature card or will the Association follow the new way with the signature on the ballot. She asked how it is determined what is published in the LVW magazine for audience comments because she feels her comment at the November 20th meeting was omitted.

Response: The Board of Trustees are applying the method that is in the current LVW Bylaws for the vote on the Bylaws Amendment. All audience comments that are stated at the meeting are published in the LVW magazine.

R. Moran spoke about the backup on Christmas Day from one to two o'clock at the Route 70 gate. She asked why the residents were not made aware of the Board reducing the open meetings to once a month and the reason why.

Response: The Association was unaware of the backup at the gate and would have acted immediately had it been reported. The open Board meetings were published in the LVW magazine and on lvwcreeper.com. The Board was able to successfully organize the different highlights of what's going on in the Village into a tighter schedule and felt once a month would be sufficient.

W. Dylewski is disappointed that the Board decided to go to once a month for open Board meetings since there was no feedback or discussion with the residents.

A. Reimer asked why the Board is discussing to add swipe access cards to the Recreation buildings.

Response: They are being added to the Recreation buildings for safety and to have a record of who is accessing the buildings.

S. Olsen asked if there was an app to download on the phone for when a maintenance worker is on the way to the unit.

Response: The app is on the workers' phone. If the Association has your cell phone number, they are able to send you a text, in advance, that they are on their way.

M. L. Ruggiero stated that she hopes the recent isolated incident is not affecting LVW to add an expense like the swipe access cards to the Recreation buildings. She asked for clarification how the new system would work for swiping at the recreation buildings.

Response: The Board realizes when there is an event people will hold the door open. The residents will swipe in for access to the building.

D. Miller asked if the new access for the Recreation buildings will be a swipe system and stated that the new technology is a tap system. She also asked if the side door at Leisure Fair could be upgraded for handicap access.

Response: The system will be that you tap your card on the reader. Residents should use the handicap access at the main door for Leisure Fair.

G. Dylewski asked who watches the cameras in the Recreation buildings.

Response: The cameras are not monitored unless an incident occurs.

P. Masterson spoke about a new system for the entry gates into the Village. She also spoke about an incident with a delivery truck that did damage to her unit. She requested that the delivery trucks supply a list of the units they are going to deliver packages to.

Response: Residents are invited to attend the townhall meeting on Wednesday, January 29th regarding the gate entry system. It is not practical for the mail/package delivery people to leave the many addresses that they are delivering to in LVW.

R. Wing asked if the swipe cards will be available on cell phones.

Response: The Board is exploring all avenues.

There being no further comments or questions, the meeting ended at approximately 2:46 PM.

Manager's Corner

Recreation Operations, Revenues and Expenses

Recreation in our Village, when first conceived, was much different from today. Budgets included recreation expenses and staffing, delivering endless hours of activities and entertainment exclusively arranged for you, the members. Over the years, clubs formed uniting people with common interests or causes, developing bylaws for and conducting the business of the clubs in an orderly fashion. Some of the bylaws included dues, which were used for various causes, including refreshments and other sundries. Entertainment, on the other hand, wasn't a part of the equation, today entertainment has become much more prevalent and now introduces a new situation.

Today, our Recreation Department faces stiff competition from clubs and groups, which has eroded Recreation revenues, making it difficult to match the related expenses of running the department. This in turn diminishes the entertainment quality that a reduced budget affords. A recreation sponsored event raises monies to offset expenses and hopefully adds a sliver of profit to put towards the next big event. Moreover, the funds stay within the community as a whole, whereas club sponsored events may only go to the benefit of the club. Some clubs even have provisions in their bylaws to donate to worthy and noble causes outside the Village, which is commendable, but again it does little to help support other members of the community itself, some of which could stand a little boost these days.

More broadly, on the budget, most of you know that a portion of your maintenance fee contribution is derived from an occupant fee. This fee is calculated based upon total recreation expenses, divided by the total population count of the Village to determine how much of your fee is attributed to the Recreation Department. As such, any deficit in recreation must be made up by an increase to the occupant fee. I know one could argue that sharing recreation expenses amongst all members is the condominium way. I'm sure you'll hear a disproportional number of people argue the other side of that, as they will say they don't participate in our events and that the ticket prices should support the

revenues and expenses from those that do.

The strain on the Recreation Department's budget has prompted us to look for other ways to help defray the costs. The 2021 Budget could include a proposed increase in the occupant fee unless we can find alternate revenues. For example, many of you know we ask clubs and groups for donations to help offset the cost of the music license. We do appreciate the clubs that do participate, but the revenues still don't match the expenses. Is it wrong to ask for a small annual service charge? Is it also wrong to ask that a small portion from a club fundraiser also contributes to this cause? Clubs and groups reserve rooms and amenities needing custodial staff to set up tables and chairs. This leads us to contemplate other ways to share this deficit.

I hope I haven't stirred the pot too much, but maybe it's time for some thoughtful deliberation on the subject. I'm sure we can all expect to hear more on this topic as we try to prepare for the 2021 budget year.

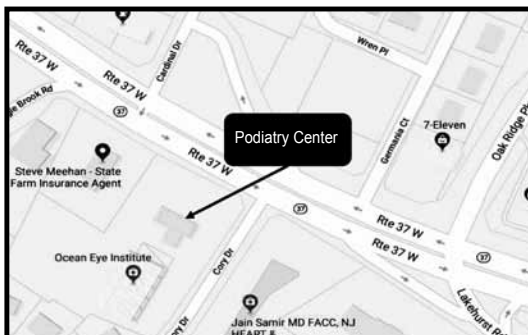

Yoga

Simply Yoga: A Class for Every Body, including Yours

Yoga's benefits are many and well-documented. They include physical flexibility and strength, increased mental acuity, and decreased anxiety and depression. Who among us would not love to receive these benefits? You have a golden opportunity to experience them yourself by taking Simply Yoga at Leisure Village West.

Participation in Simply Yoga is free and is open to all LVW residents. There is a core group of 'regulars,' and drop-ins are always welcome. We are a friendly bunch, who range in age from mid-50's to early-90's. You may have heard that our classes are only for the 80-plus crowd. Not so! Our younger participants assure us they love the thoroughness of a class that stretches every muscle from top to toe each time.

Stiff in the morning? We use a series of gentle poses, designed by an experienced yoga instructor. Hate those long holds, which make you feel like you're dying? Our poses are held for a maximum of five or six seconds at a time. We repeat them to achieve a progressively deeper stretch without straining.

After the poses there's a short period of relaxation, during which body and mind are gently coaxed into stillness. This integrates the practice, resulting in a feeling of grounded, peaceful awareness. Our practice does not conflict with any religious beliefs. We chant the vowels and letters of the alphabet, honoring our own linguistic heritage. Towards the end, we chant OM, in gratitude to those who gave us yoga. This latter practice is optional.

Barb, a regular member of the class, has been a certified yoga teacher for over 20 years. We're so pleased she chose our class when she returned to yoga for her own well-being. She says, "The postures and movements in our class open and stretch the body with minimal physical effort so that you can easily follow the flow-- bringing awareness to just about every part of your body. This class is calming, nurturing and especially valuable when you feel stressed out."

Generally speaking, yoga can benefit anybody, and those with physical challenges can make their own adaptations. A chair can be used to help you balance,

or get down to or up from the floor, or you can just sit in a chair and follow along. Worried you're not fit enough for yoga? We come in all shapes and sizes and levels of fitness. The more regularly you attend, the more your fitness will slowly improve.

We welcome men. I realize that yoga can be a hard sell for guys. Most men are not instant yoga experts because of cultural rules they grew up with about how men should move. And it can be awkward being in a class where there are always more women than men. Be brave, guys! We have a spot in the back of the class for you. The women are encouraging and helpful, or, if you prefer, we'll mostly ignore you and let you find your own way.

Beginners are more than welcome to experience a class! You will need comfortable clothing and a yoga mat; some also bring water bottles. Still not convinced? You're welcome to come and quietly observe a class before deciding to join.

If you've ever wondered if yoga is for you, why not give it a try? It's made a difference in the flexibility, strength, ability to balance, and peace of mind of so many of us. We'd be happy to have you join us.

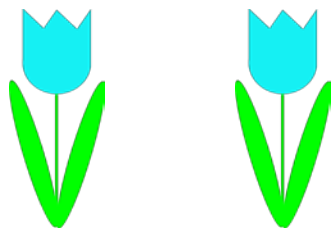

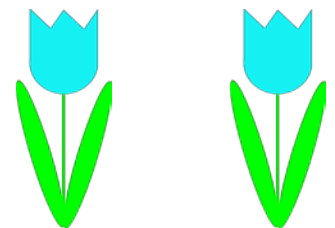

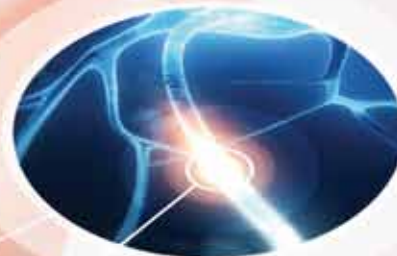

## Nature Soars!

Before they evolved into CONRAIL and CSX, the railroads that plied our portion of the state were the Central New Jersey Line (CNJ which originated in the 1830s), Pennsylvania Railroad, and Tuckerton Railroad. All brought passengers, not freight, to the Jersey shore. Day-trippers from New York, Jersey City, and Philadelphia enriched and enlivened our shore communities, with Lakehurst becoming a major nexus. This information, and so much more, was brought to us by German Georgieff, Chief Park Naturalist at Ocean County Parks and Recreation at our January meeting.

Here's something to celebrate: Despite the doom and gloom that perennially characterizes nature reporting, 2019 has proven a banner year. The California Academy of Sciences, working in concert with their international counterparts, has identified 71 new species of plants and animals. Covering five continents, three oceans, and every conceivable landscape, the robust list came to include two wasps, two corals, two lizards, two mosses, two skates, three skinks, three ants, four eels, five arachnids, six

sea slugs, eight flowering plants, 15 geckos, and 17 species of fish.

That so much of our planet remains unexplored seems unfathomable. Yet Shannon Bennett, PhD, the Academy's Chief of Science, postulates "that more than 90% of nature's species remain unknown. A rich diversity of plants and animals is what allows life on our planet to thrive: the interconnectedness of all living systems provides collective resilience in the face of our climate crisis."

Of course, this dazzling bounty of discoveries demands that crucial habitats be protected worldwide as scrupulously as possible to sustain these wondrous species. In the face of conflicting economic interests and rapidly disappearing environs, the challenge is monumental.

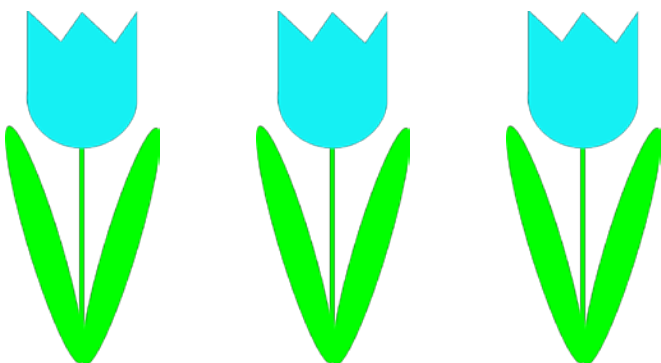

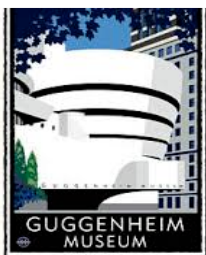

Well they tell me it's fun, but the only way to find out is to be at Willow Hall on Sunday, **March 8** from noon to 4 pm for lunch and a game of Bunco sponsored by the LVW Fishing Club.

Ever played Bunco? Don't look at me, I never even heard of it until today. I'm told Bunco is a fun social dice game with four players at each table. These are the basics:

1. A game of Bunco is played in 2 to 4 sets with 6 rounds in each set.
2. The player at the head table rings a bell signaling the beginning and end of each round.
3. Players at each table take turns rolling three dice trying to earn points. All tables play simultaneously.
4. During each round, players attempt to roll the same number as the number of the round, (for example, rolling 3's in the 3rd round would earn the player points).
5. For every number rolled that matches the round number, one point is awarded to that player.
6. Players keep rolling until they score no points. The scorekeeper then records the score they earned onto the table tally as the temporary team score. Then the dice are passed to the player on the left.

7. When the head table has earned 21 points the round is over and the head table then rings a bell to signal the round has ended.

8. At the end of every round players change partners and/or tables.

9. At the end of the game there are typically multiple "winners". The players with the most Buncos, wins, losses, etc. may earn prizes for their successes.

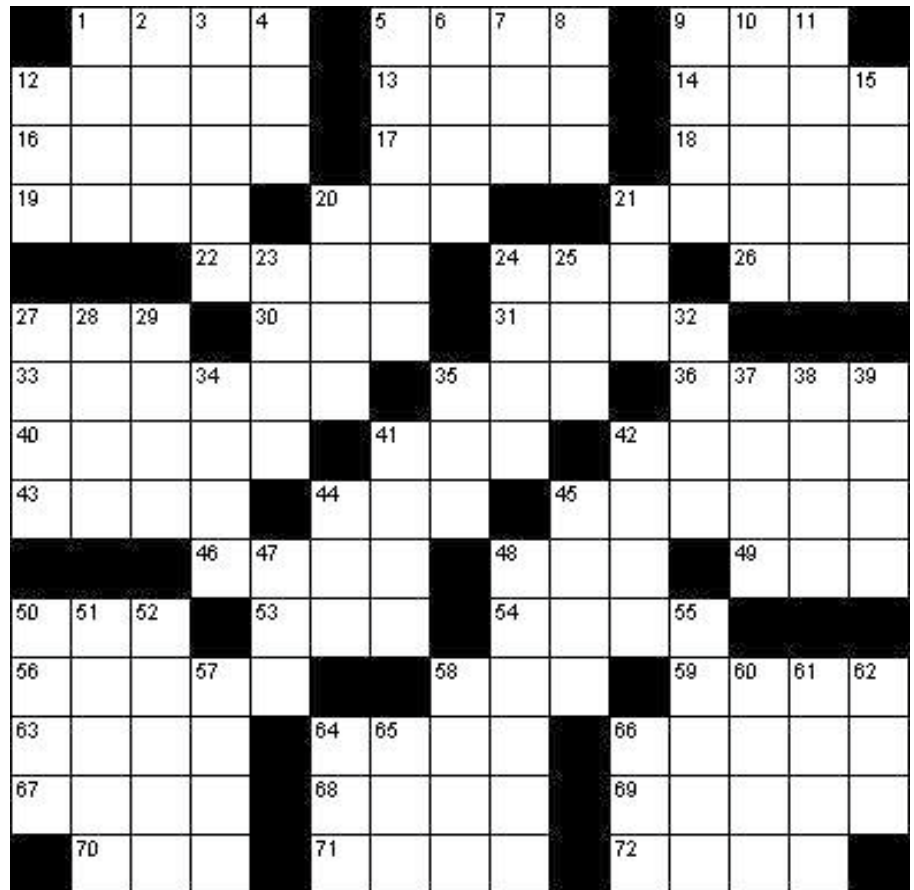

### Top 2019 Frauds

Workshops continue to be held every Thursday at 10 am in the Club Encore card room. This month's scheduled dates are: March 5, March 12, March 19, and March 26. We ask all members to refer to the weekly Club e-mail we send out for specific topics we will be discussing. There will be no March general meeting.

Each year, the Federal Trade Commission takes a hard look at the number of reports people make to the Consumer Sentinel Network. In fact, during 2019, they received more than 3.2 million reports to the FTC. Here are the top frauds reported in 2019 per the ftc.gov website:

- **Imposter scams was the number one fraud reported to Sentinel in 2019.** People reported losing more than \$667 million to imposters, who often pretended to be calling from the government or a well-known business, a romantic interest, or a family member with an emergency. When people lost money, they most frequently reported paying scammers with a gift card.

- **Social Security imposters were the top government imposter scam reported.** There were 166,190 reports about the Social Security scam. The median individual loss was \$1,500.

- **Phone calls were the number one way people reported being contacted by scammers.** While most people said they hung up on those calls, those who lost money reported a median loss of \$1,000 in 2019.

You might wonder what comes out of reporting scams and consumer issues to the FTC. Your reports enable the FTC and its law enforcement to investigate the people and companies that trick people into paying money. Your reports help build and bring those cases. This reporting also helps enforce laws that stop scams and other dishonest business practices that take people's money.

In fact, during 2019, FTC law enforcement actions led to more than \$232 million in refunds to people who lost money. More than 1.9 million people cashed checks mailed by the FTC. In the last four years, people have cashed more than one billion dollars in FTC refund checks. If you've spotted a scam, keep reporting about it at [ftc.gov/complaint](https://www.ftc.gov/complaint). # Recycling Club News

Is Winter over yet??? As I write this in January, we have had every kind of weather: from arctic freezes to balmy April showers. Snow squalls to 68 degrees of sunshine. We should remember that we have to take care of Mother Nature, or She will surely blast us off the face of the Earth. One task we can all do is **recycle**.

We, all the residents, have two ways to recycle. Number one is making use of our own Newspaper Recycling Trailer where we accept bundled newspapers, shredded papers, and junk mail (put into windproof bags of some type), hard and soft covered books, and bundled magazines and catalogs. Do not drop any other products in the trailer. No cardboard of any type. No other recycled materials (no metal, no plastic).

Please note: we do have a garbage bin labeled "plastic," this is for the sole use of volunteers to discard the (few) plastic bags left by people who dropped off junk mail and shredded paper. Volunteers remove everything put into this garbage can. Plastic bags go into your regular garbage at home.

The Number two way to recycle is to make use of our town's generous pick-up service. A single container/mix-use service. **Do not put out for collection in plastic bags.** Please note that only certain plastics are recycled ---never, ever plastic bags. No cardboard except corrugated cardboard can be recycled. Cereal boxes and other light-weight

cardboard go into your regular garbage container.

The Newspaper Recycling trailer is open 24/7 all year. On certain days volunteers are at the trailer to assist residents who like our help to empty their car.

Volunteers are at the trailer from 9 am to noon. One day a month between March and November, a volunteer will help shut-in residents by picking up newspapers, etc. from their homes. This service is only for people who cannot drive to the trailer.
