Willow Hall Auditorium

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM by Board President, Fay Weinstein with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT: <u>Trustees:</u> Present were President - Fay Weinstein, Vice President - Wayne Steinman, Secretary - Steven Leslierandal, Trustee - Charles Lupo, Trustee - Al DAmato and Trustee - Ivan Gilbert. Absent was Treasurer - Eugene Murphy.

<u>Management Staff:</u> Present were Community Manager – Jim Snyder, Accounting Administrator – Michelle Lampard and Recreation Director – Mary Lighthipe.

J. Snyder introduced Keith Fallon, Grounds Manager and Victor Demeski, Building Maintenance Manager. (There was a brief recess from 1:14 PM to 1:16 PM due to interruption from an audience member)

ITEMS VOTED ON: (continued in Community Manager's Report and New Business)

S. Leslierandal moved to waive the reading of the minutes. W. Steinman seconded. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

S. Leslierandal moved to approve the February 7, 2024 minutes. I. Gilbert seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

A.DAmato moved to approve the revisions to the Terms and Conditions for Architectural Specifications. S. Leslierandal seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

W. Steinman moved to approve the Bylaws Amendment pertaining to Fines. S. Leslierandal seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried. (S. Bowker stated that the mailing of the ballots will take place on March 7, 2024 and a special meeting will be held on Monday, April 8, 2024).

I.Gilbert moved to contract with Allied Universal Security for security guards/pool attendants for the 2024 pool season at a cost of \$58,503.50. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #8570 – Swimming Pool R&M. W. Steinman seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

C. Lupo moved to approve the purchase of seven (7) Intellichlor IC-60 Salt Cells from Baystate Pools for a cost of 9,627.04. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3230 - Capital Replacement/Common Buildings. S. Leslierandal seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

S. Leslierandal moved to approve the purchase of a Moyer commercial dishwasher from Johnson's Restaurant Equipment Inc. for a cost of \$4,797.06. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3230 – Capital Replacement/Common Buildings. W. Steinman seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

A.DAmato moved to approve the purchase of three (3) pump motors from Supreme Water Sales for a cost of \$4,536.24. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3260 – Capital Replacement/Irrigation-Well Motors. S. Leslierandal seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

W. Steinman moved to release the funding to replace up to ten (10) cluster mailboxes, in-house at a cost not to exceed \$25,000.00. This expense will be provided by account #3230 – Capital Replacement/Common Buildings. I. Gilbert seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

I.Gilbert moved to approve the 2024 driveway replacement schedule for 27 cement driveways, in-house at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.00. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by

COMMUNITY MANAGER'S REPORT: (J. Snyder)

K. Fallon, Grounds Manager was present and stated that the second half of the **mower fleet** is due for replacement. The current plan includes two years of in-warranty repairs and one year of out-of-warranty repairs. It has been proven to be the most cost-effective way to keep repair and maintenance costs to a minimum. The following bids have been received;

Management is recommending the Board approve to trade-in the seven (7) existing mowers and purchase seven (7) 48-inch Ex-Mark Navigators from County Line Power Equipment for a total cost of \$93,830.02. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3150 – Property Fund Replacement. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

J. Snyder stated that management is anticipating replacing 50 additional residential **electrical panels** in the 2024 budget year. He is seeking approval to move forward with funding for this year's funding within the adopted electrical panel replacement program. He is requesting funding not to exceed \$65,000.00 to replace these panels. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3295 – Capital Replacement/Unit Infrastructure. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

H. Height, I.T./Facilities Manager stated the Board has asked Management to research the costs of a **Fuel Management System** for the gasoline and diesel used for the Village's trucks and equipment. Currently there are three fuel storage tanks on site at the Maintenance yard. There is a need to accurately track and account the amount of fuel used in each vehicle or piece of machinery. He went out to bid and the following were received;

Management is recommending purchasing a fuel management system from Fuel Transfer Inc. for a cost of \$8,708.56, contracting with Toms River Heating and A/C to do the required plumbing for a cost of \$2,332.81, and Curry Electric for the required electrical work for a cost of \$2,368.31, including Manchester Township permits for a cost of \$500.00, totaling cost is \$13,909.68. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3230 – Capital Replacement/Common Buildings. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

H. Height stated that the **stage lighting** at the auditorium in Club Encore is in need of replacement. It is the original system from when the Hall opened. The system is now obsolete and not fully functioning. Management would like to install a new system like the one in Willow Hall. Resident volunteers will be able to operate the systems at both Halls with the same training and familiarity. Management consulted with Hayden Production Services on the design. He went out to bid on the lighting and equipment. The prices are as follows;

Management is recommending purchasing the ColorSource 40 Lighting Console/Stage Lights and accessories from Hayden Production Services for a cost of \$29,056.11. He is also recommending contracting with Hayden Productions Services to install and program the lighting system for a cost of \$3,731.88, totaling cost is \$32,787.99. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3230 – Capital Replacement/ Common Buildings. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

J. Snyder stated the **Bus contract** expires on March 31, 2024. The bid process began in January, and the initial bids received are as follows;

The lowest bid came in at a 60% increase or \$60,720.00. A small group of a few Board members, the Recreation Director, and a frequent bus-riding resident looked at the current bus schedule and ridership numbers and determined that changes could be made to the current schedule while still providing adequate service to our bus-riding residents. Management went out to bid again with a revised bus schedule, and below are the revised bids;

Following is a brief outline of the property insurance carried by your association as written through Philadelphia Indemnity Insurance Company:

In accordance with your association's governing documents, all buildings comprising Leisure Village West Association are insured on an "Original Specifications" basis with a Replacement Cost valuation provision. Put simply, this means that each unit is covered in its entirety in accordance with the builder's original specifications subject to the policy limit (less any applicable deductible). Deductibles are applied on a *per occurrence* basis (currently \$10,000) as well as a \$5,000 per unit Ice Damming Deductible. Coverage is written on a "Special Perils" basis meaning that all perils are covered except those specifically excluded such as (but not limited to) Flood, Earthquake, Nuclear Accidents, and War. (Additional coverage may have been purchased to delete one or more of these exclusions.)

While very broad in scope, the association's master policy is not intended to cover personal property, loss of use (temporary rental assistance), loss assessment, upgrades or improvements made by any unitowners (past or present), or their personal liability. In light of this, it is highly recommended that each owner and/or tenant consult with their insurance professional and provide them with the above information when determining their personal insurance needs. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #7430 – Bus Lease. W. Steinman seconded. There was no discussion and a vote was called. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

Management went out to bid for the 2024 **roofing project** for labor only. Shingles will be purchased in bulk and presented separately. This year's project consists of 49 buildings which consist of 112 units. RFPs were sent out to 23 area roofing contractors. Nine contractors submitted bids. The bids received are as follows;

Management is recommending contracting with Fischer Roofing for labor only for the 2024 Roofing Project at a cost of \$288,805.00 and approve in-house debris removal at a cost of \$10,000.00, totaling cost of \$298,805.00. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3270 – Capital Replacement/Roofs. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

Leisure Village West transitioned last year from 3-tab shingles to dimensional shingles on residential units. Management went out to bid to six area material suppliers to obtain pricing on the **bulk purchase of roofing material** for the 2024 roofing project. The bids received are as follows;

Management is recommending purchasing the required roofing material from Beacon Exterior Materials for a cost of \$280,193.61. The funds to meet this expense will be provided by account #3270 – Capital Replacement/ Roofs. The Board will vote on this at the next open Board meeting on April 3, 2024.

LVW Insurance Policy expires on April 15, 2024. Management will have quotes back from our Insurance Agent mid-March. We are anticipating a six percent increase.

The Association will need to hire either a Reserve Specialist, a Licensed Engineer, or a Licensed Architect to prepare a reserve study as stated in the new law for **Reserve Study and Funding Obligations** in S2760/

A4384. This reserve study must be completed by January 8, 2025. The Association is currently out to bid.

Update on Club Encore Patio Structure: The footings have been dug out. The engineer needs to redo a footing due to an LVW wire.

Update on Bocce Courts at Club Encore: The Township Planning Board has approved to extend the shade structure.

Pets: Owners must always maintain full control of the animal. Pets must be walked in the streets (at the curb) and in such open or wooded areas not used for recreational purposes or parking facilities, or in common areas. Residents are not to walk their pets between units.

Parking Spaces: The Association continues inspecting for violations. No overnight parking between the hours of 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM is permitted. The parking spaces in front of Willow Hall that were 30-minute spaces have now been converted to handicap spaces. The Association is adding spaces at each recreation building for residents by permit only to park in an assigned space between 10:30 PM and 7:30 AM. The policy for parking in these spaces will be placed in the Resident's Handbook. A fee will be applied for those parking spaces.

Phone Directory: There were errors in the phone directory and Management reached out to the publisher. An updated version of the phone directory is posted every month on Frontsteps.

BOARD OF TRUSTEE'S REPORT: (F. Weinstein)

Residents are reminded to set their clocks forward an hour on March 10 at 2:00 AM. Coffee with the Board will take place at Club Encore, Greenery Room on Saturday, April 6 if any resident wishes to provide ideas, complaints, etc. to a Board member. The Board is researching different options/programs to reduce speeding in the Village. Drivers are asked to be cautious of residents walking.



Audience Comments - March 6, 2024

Willow Hall Auditorium

An open forum followed the business portion of the open Board meeting at 3:00 PM with residents raising questions or concerns or seeking clarification about a variety of issues. For exact content, please refer to FRONTSTEPS for the video recording of this meeting.

The Rules of Public Comment and Participation in the Open Forum were presented on the agenda.

Resident: Stephanie Barnes from 575B Sheffield Drive stated she moved here because her husband passed away and she could no longer take care of her home the way it needed to be taken care of. She liked the amenities for LVW. It was stated by Management that it would cost less if the residents used the dumpster on Holidays instead of pick up at the unit. She stated that she slipped and fell on uneven concrete and has not put in a claim since it will affect all the residents. She asked if the Association owns the dumpsters. She also asked what happens when the dumpsters are overflowing. She cannot pick her garbage up to throw it over the top. She also asked if an employee is coming in to lighten the load when the dumpster is overfilled. She believes people are taking advantage of the use of the dumpsters.

Response: Yes, we own the dumpsters. The doors on the dumpsters should always be open for easy access. Someone is on-site to monitor the dumpster during business hours including Holidays.

<u>Resident:</u> Beverly Craft from 687A Friar Court requested to make a comment about the speed limit in LVW. She stated that many people interpret the double yellow line as decoration. She asked the Board to address speeding and the double line passers.

Response: Speeding is on the Board's agenda to review and discuss.

Resident: Robert Pergola (Ricardo Garcia) from 86B Buckingham Drive stated that Ricardo is very active in the community and has received a lot of praise and recognition. He spoke about the Board rejecting a proposed Group by Ricardo because it's like KLVW-TV even though other Groups are like each other. They proposed another Group and it was accepted. He stated that almost everything Ricardo does seems to be getting pushback and scrutiny from the Board to include a Board member treating him in a hostile way. He also stated that hundreds of people thanked him for the Holiday video except one person on the Board via social media. He thinks Ricardo deserves thanks and appreciation and a round of applause for all that he has done. He asked for an apology.

<u>Response</u>: The Board does not recognize what happens/said on Facebook. The Board understands that the current issue is in regards to a document that was submitted for publication and was asked to address that and not personally attack a Board member. Board member stated they are sorry if their feelings had been hurt.

<u>Resident</u>: Dorothy Miller from 9B Cambridge Circle stated that a few years back, the gas company wanted to come in and install gas lines but the Association had a moratorium on roads. She asked if the Village can reach out to the gas company for them to come back in after the moratorium has passed. She also asked if there is research being done for those not able to get the gas lines to be allowed to have generators.

Response: The Community Manager will research this and be happy to contact them. Currently, residents are allowed to get home battery backup generators.

<u>Resident:</u> Joy Carmody from 576A Sheffield Drive stated she is thrilled that Fischer made a bid on the roofing contract for LVW. She agreed that people should not be disparaged on the Board.

Resident: James Shamburg from 2B Yorkshire Court mentioned that he had gas heat installed in 2022 and only needed to convert one thing.

The meeting ended at approximately 3:22 PM.

With a heavy heart, we report that one of our longtime members, good players, and a great friend to all, Fred Keingarsky passed away in March. We will miss you, Fred!





Fishing & Social Club

Our next meeting is Thursday, May 2 at 2 p.m. in the Willow Hall Ceramics Room. It will be good to see familiar faces again. May is a busy time of the year with spring, yard and car cleaning, not to mention social events taking priority, but it's time to wet a line, if you have not done so yet. Back in March, saltwater regulations were firmed up. A decision on the fluke (a/k/a summer flounder) season was made. The season starts May 2 and extends to September 25, allowing 3 fish at 18 inches. This was the longest proposed season, but it was at a cost of larger size fish. It always seemed to me that I caught fish that were always a half-inch short of legal size. The good thing is that this size and season regulation will remain in 2025, which will help charter and party boat captains schedule trips for next year.

The sea bass season starts May 17, with the 10-fish limit at 12 and-a-half inches, and continues to June 19. After that, it reduces to 1 fish for the remainder of the fluke season. From all sources that I have, the sea bass population is healthy, but data management of this valuable resource is flawed, and that affects seasons and size regulations. Porgy season is open until June 30 with 30 fish at 10 inches.

Fishing reports for the canal, bay and beach are sparse, but should only improve. Blood worms are expensive at \$24-\$28 a dozen, but they will take bass, blacks and flounder as their appetites increase.

Warm weather and warm water should have the bass and sunfish on the beds soon, and they do get territorial at anything cast their way. Early spring, I did see an occasional bass rippling the water. Hopefully, the heavy rains and winds this spring don't dampen the fishing scene much.

The weather is getting warmer and friendlier, so I am eagerly awaiting stories of the one that got away. Always willing to listen, but if I am doing my job, I prefer to hear good reports instead. In the meantime, check your reels, line, sharpen the hooks and just make sure that you are 100% ready for the task. You will enjoy it more.

Binoculars = Super Vision

There are few things that can make a walk outside in nature more enjoyable. A good friend is at the very top of that list. But in second place, I would say that a good pair of binoculars is the best thing that we can buy to make the outdoors more enjoyable. I have led plenty of nature walks over the years, and repeatedly have seen participants who get frustrated and give up because they are struggling to use out-of-date, hand-me-down inferior binoculars or binoculars that were designed for a different purpose than observing the natural world. Good binoculars, on the other hand, allow us to see much more, and to see greater detail than when using our eyes alone; it's like having super vision!

So, if you are one of the many people who would like to enjoy nature more, consider upgrading the optics as a major first step. How should we decide which ones to buy? As with most purchases, you get what you pay for, but for most people, binoculars in the \$150 - \$300 range are incredibly good and can be superior to the top-of-the line binoculars from 20 years ago. To my mind, that is a miniscule cost for years or decades of viewing pleasure.

The most popular size is 8x42 or 8x32, where the first number is the magnification, and the second number is the size of the objective lens. The larger the objective is, the more light it gathers, but the heavier it becomes, so it is a balance between those considerations. Binoculars with greater magnification or larger lenses are designed for specialized purposes and are not worth the extra weight to the general user. Good binoculars these days often have a close focus distance of around 6 ft. or less, which makes it possible to view butterflies or flowers that are nearly at our feet, while still allowing views of distant objects, such as eagles, or even the moon.

If you will be spending time outdoors, consider treating yourself to new optics. After all, who doesn't want super vision? If you are considering purchasing binoculars and need additional help or advice, feel free to contact me.

Nature Club is on hiatus during May due to Memorial Day observance. We'll see you again in Willow Hall at 7 p.m. on June 24 for a program about Jellyfish.

SPECIFICATION FOR INSTALLATION OF NATURAL GAS LINE INTO RESIDENCE A MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP PERMIT IS REOUIRED

- 1. All work is to be performed in accordance with generally accepted trade practices by a licensed and insured contractor experienced in making attachments to gas lines. A current copy of the insurance must be filed with the Association office.
- 2. Installation shall comply with Code A.N.S.I. Z 223.1 (1974), with all local ordinances and with the conditions stipulated on the diagram on page 2 of this specification. The contractor is responsible for selecting the proper tubing size to satisfy the cubic feet per hour requirement as specified in the table at the included in this specification.
- 3. The gas line shall be from the main gas line to unit wall where the gas meter will be located. A diagram must be included indicating the pathway and meter locations.
- 4. If there is any question of the underground portion of this installation crossing existing subterranean gas, electrical, telephone, cable or water lines, the owner is advised to contact the involved utility and arrange for surface marking of the exact line location(s). The owner is responsible for any damage to these lines resulting from this installation.
- 5. The responsibility and all expenses for the installation of the gas line from the main gas line to the residence is the sole responsibility of the Unit Owner.
- 6. A Leisure Village West Association Approved Permit is required for this installation by a licensed contractor with liability and property damage insurance coverage registered with the LVW Association. The Association reserves the right to inspect the completed installation.
- 7. The owner must notify the Architectural Committee volunteer (name and phone number shown on the face of the permit) when the installation is completed.



SPECIFICATION FOR NATURAL GAS HOME BACKUP GENERATOR MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP PERMITS REQUIRED

INSTALLATION

A Leisure Village West Association Permit and a Manchester Township permit are required for this installation. The Association requires installation by a licensed contractor, registered with the Division of Consumer Affairs. The contractor must furnish the Association with a current certificate of insurance before the owner can apply for a permit and before work can begin.

SPECIFICATION – GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The Home Backup Generator runs on natural gas from the homeowner's gas line at the expense of the homeowner. **Propane installations are prohibited.**
- 2. The size of the unit will depend upon whether you are backing up your entire residence or just the essential items.
- 3. Most home backup generators are air cooled units with steel or aluminum enclosures. Composite plastic enclosures are prohibited.
- 4. The color of the unit should be consistent with the color of the air conditioning unit of the residence.
- 5. The Generator is **required** to be installed a **minimum of 5 feet from any window or door**, 36 inches from anything combustible (flammable items) and 18 inches from any non-combustibles (non-flammable).
- 6. Homeowner's electric box upgrades, including installing a switch box, are at the expense of the homeowner and must be installed by a licensed insured electrician.
- 7. The air-cooled generator models come mounted on a composite pad to simplify installation. NOTE: The liquid-cooled generators are larger and more complex and will require a stronger mounting surface, such as a concrete slab.
- 8. Local codes require "Generator on Premise" sticker for your main breaker panel and utility meter. These stickers warn an emergency responder to be careful of the large units that contain gas, so it can be disconnected in case of emergency.
- 9. Township permits are needed Manchester Electric, Plumbing and Building permits and town inspection of final installation is required.
- 10. The newer Generators have been made quieter than those in the past. The Generator will require a weekly test, which must be scheduled to test on a <u>Monday or Tuesday between the hours of 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM</u>.
- 11. It is imperative that regular maintenance is scheduled to ensure your generator is ready for whenever a power outage may occur.

GAS LINE INSTALLATION SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. All work is to be performed in accordance with generally accepted trade practices by a contractor experienced in making attachments to gas lines. Installation shall comply with Code A.N.S.I. Z 223.1 (1974), with all local ordinances and with the conditions stipulated on the diagram included in this specification. The contractor is responsible for selecting the proper tubing size to satisfy the cubic feet per hour requirement dependent on size, as specified in the table at the bottom of this section.
- 2. The generator shall be located within the five-foot area and at least 5 feet away from the any windows or doors.
- 3. If there is any question of the underground portion of this installation crossing existing subterranean gas, electrical, telephone, cable or water lines, the owner is advised to contact the involved utility and arrange for surface marking of the exact line location(s). The owner is responsible for any damage to these lines resulting from this installation.
- 4. The installer of the gas line must review the property before the sale and provide a diagram of the generator installation including the gas line and trenching needed.

ELECTRICAL INSTALLATION SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. An LVW permit for Electrical work is also required.
- 2. Homeowner's electric box upgrades, including installing a switch box for the generator, are at the expense of the homeowner.
- 3. The electrical equipment must be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 4. The installation requires a Manchester Electrical Bureau permit and inspection.
- 5. Electrical updates may be required depending upon the size of the generator and whether you are backing up the entire residence or just some essential items. The installer/contractor will guide you with the amount of amperage needed for your backup requirements.
- 6. Local codes require "generator on premise" stickers for your main breaker panel and utility meter. These stickers warn an emergency responder to be careful of the large units that contain gas. In the event of an emergency, they would disconnect the fuel for the unit to prevent serious damage.

- 2. Any work performed in an owner's unit or on the common area, including foundation planting beds outside the unit, is subject to all State laws, Municipal ordinances, and Association regulations.
- 3. If any work, installation, or improvement, whether approved or unapproved, causes any damage to any Unit, the General Common Elements, or Limited Common Elements, the Unit Owner(s) associated with **the work improvement shall be solely responsible for the same. By installation of any improvement**, whether approved or unapproved, the Unit Owner(s) agree, for themselves and for their successors and assigns, to indemnify, defend and, hold the Association harmless with respect to any claim, damage or any injury to any person or thing related to the improvement and/or the installation, modification, maintenance, use or removal of the improvement.
- 4. By the execution and acceptance of this permit and its terms and conditions the owner understands that the installation, when completed, and then forming a part of the Common area, will not be insured by the Leisure Village West Association against, any loss or for any Indemnification.
- 5. The owner acknowledges that the responsibility to repair and maintain said improvement rests solely with the owner and does not and will not be the responsibility of the Leisure Village West Association.
- 6. All work will be subject to inspection by Leisure Village West Association. The owner together with the contractor or workman will be responsible for any deviations from the approved permit and will be required to make any necessary corrections at the owner's expense.
- 7. The inspection is for the sole purpose of verifying the owner's compliance with the plans, diagram and/or specifications and is not intended to warrant the quality, correctness or compliance with contracts or codes of any work performed. The Association accepts no liability should the installation be improperly installed or if the installation causes damage to the unit, another unit, or the common elements.
- 8. Work improvements cannot be performed without approved permits from Leisure Village West Association and proper permits if required for Building, Electrical, Plumbing, etc. from Manchester Township Bureau of Inspections or County and be in compliance with all State laws and municipal ordinances.
- 9. For the protection of the owner and the Leisure Village West Association, the services must be performed by a licensed contractor with proper insurance coverage, unless otherwise indicated with the Specification.




